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Alongside these visible milestones, the school also navigated campus-related developments reflecting the broader growth of our city and region. In 2025, the **City of Sioux Falls**, in collaboration with **Sanford Health**, began a **regional stormwater retention pond project adjacent to the SFLS campus** on land acquired along the school's southern border. This City-led project supports anticipated growth tied to the future **I-29 and 85th Street interchange** and is expected to be completed by **March 2026**. Throughout the process, we remain committed to clear communication, strong collaboration with community partners, and maintaining a **safe, well-cared-for campus**.

A temporary safety fence (shown in red dashes on the rendering) will soon be installed—likely by the end of next week.

As weather allows, workers and equipment will be on site periodically throughout the remainder of the winter. After the project is complete, landscaping will be restored in the spring. SFLS will install a permanent fence along the pond property line during the summer.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as this work takes place and as we continue efforts to maintain a safe and well-cared-for campus.



The SFLS K–12 Mentor Program: Should Your Child Have a Mentor?



There is no replacement for the vital role of parents in the lives of children. To accentuate that beautiful relationship, Sioux Falls Lutheran School is excited to share a special opportunity for your child to receive a mentor. By having a mentor, your child will be bolstered in the confidence that he/she is important.

Our Mentor Program is designed to pair one caring adult with a student for a simple weekly lunch-time visit. Students are recommended by parents and/or their classroom teacher after receiving parental permission. From there, our team thoughtfully matches each child with a trained mentor whose gifts and personality fit well. Mentoring isn't about having all the answers—it's about showing up, listening, and helping a child feel valued and seen.

We are now seeking referrals/requests for students to receive a mentor. **Parents**, if you feel even the slightest nudge, we encourage you to **read the FAQs below** and prayerfully consider connecting with your child's teacher so they can participate in this meaningful ministry.

FAQs

What is a "mentor"?

A Christian adult or high school student who cares about the students at our school and who has the ability to consistently set aside time each week to be with a particular student during the lunch break. All mentors have undergone a thorough background check and have received training.

What would my child be doing when his/her mentor visits?

Most importantly, they will be getting to know each other. Your child will soon learn that the mentor is someone he or she can depend on. Your child and the mentor will decide on a day each week that works for them to meet during the lunch hour. The mentor will arrive at the school and walk with your child to the reading area. Once there, your student will eat lunch, and together they will choose a game or other activity. During the game, they will talk, share about their life, and pray for one another. The mentor will offer encouragement and gently offer suggestions that may help your child address any challenges he/she may be facing – difficult classes, problems with friends, anxiety over school concerns, etc. Once the hour is ended, the two will part ways until the following week.

What do I need to do to get a mentor for my child?

Please contact your child's teacher, who will send home a permission form and may ask some questions. Together, the information you provide will be crucial to pairing your child with a mentor who has similar interests.

How much will it cost to get a mentor for my child?

Absolutely free! Grants and generous donations cover all costs associated with the SFLS Mentor Program.

There is no cost to families who utilize the program.

What if I change my mind?

Matches will be made as needed and as mentors are available. If you decide to apply later, it may delay your child's pairing with a mentor. If your child is paired with a mentor and you or your child decides not to participate in the program, please simply contact your child's teacher or the program coordinators. (They will likely ask your reason to help us improve the mentoring experience for everyone.)

How can my child participate in the mentor program?

Other tuition & fees related changes for 2026-27:

- Multi-child discount: **\$500** per additional student. *The multi-child discount cannot be combined with any other discounts, with the exception of the association church rate.*
- A **change fee of \$50** will apply to any preschool schedule change that happens on or after June 1 and reduces the amount of time a child is present in the classroom.

K-12 Needs-Based Variable Tuition Applications for 2026-27 School Year Open on January 26

Sioux Falls Lutheran School's K-12 needs-based variable tuition application window for the 2026-27 school year will open through TADS on Monday, January 26. Thanks to our expanding list of generous donors who continue to graciously invest in our mission through donations to our [needs-based variable tuition](#) fund, we are preparing to award up to \$400,000 in needs-based variable tuition to qualifying families during the 2026-27 school year.

To apply, please log into or create a TADS account for your family at www.mytads.com by clicking on "Financial Aid Assessment." TADS will provide a complete list of required documentation before you begin your application, but please know that items like your previous year's tax return are required.

South Dakota Partners in Education (SDPE) K-12 Scholarship Program

In addition to donor-funded variable tuition through SFLS, qualifying families are also eligible to submit their TADS application to the [South Dakota Partners in Education \(SDPE\)](#) K-12 scholarship program. During the 2025-26 school year alone, SFLS families qualified for over \$206,000 in tuition assistance through SDPE, which allowed us to spread our own variable tuition budget even further. If your family qualifies for SDPE and you plan to apply for variable tuition, please plan to submit your application to both entities.

Earn Tuition Credit through RaiseRight

Finally, please also remember that [RaiseRight](#) is available as a source of tuition assistance for all early childhood through 12th grade families. Simply buy gift cards for your favorite brands at face value through RaiseRight and use them, instead of cash or other cards, to make purchases. A percentage of each gift card you buy goes directly into an account for your family and gets applied toward your tuition at designated times throughout the course of the school year.



ENERGY DRINKS & THC DRINKS: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Children's and adolescents' bodies and brains are still developing; what they consume is important. What may feel like a boost or "trendy" can cause real physical, emotional, and mental consequences. Understanding what kind of ingredients are in popular brands is important in keeping your child safe and healthy.

Energy Drinks



16 fl oz can = 160 mg caffeine



12 fl oz can = 200 mg caffeine



12 fl oz can = 200 mg caffeine



8.4 fl oz can = 80 mg caffeine



12 fl oz can = 69 mg caffeine

Energy drinks contain high levels of caffeine, added sugars, and legal stimulants (i.e., Taurine, Guarana, Ginseng, L-Carnitine, Glucuronolactone) that are used to increase alertness and energy. However, children who consume high levels of caffeine can have difficulty sleeping and may develop behavioral or mental health issues, like increased aggression, anxiety, stress, and depression. According to the FDA, the recommended caffeine intake for healthy adults is no more than 400 milligrams per day.

Watch Out For What Your Child Might Be Drinking!

THC is the main psychoactive compound in cannabis and is responsible for the "high" feeling. THC drinks can be easily confused with energy drinks because they often mimic popular can designs and flavors, and some even combine THC with caffeine. This creates a significant risk for accidental consumption by children, teens, or unsuspecting adults who mistake them for other energy drinks. It is crucial to read the label to distinguish these THC drinks from standard energy drinks.

Important Message to Parents

The branding done by these companies can be extremely appealing and persuasive. It's important to learn more about what's inside and take a deeper look. Stay informed and make thoughtful choices.


