As a family community at Sioux Falls Lutheran School, we partner together to nurture students in a safe, caring, and peace-filled Christian environment. In support of our shared commitment to safety and community, we ask for your help in making our parking lot a positive and orderly space during drop-off and pick-up times.

Recent ParentPulse feedback indicates that parking lot flow, safety, and drop-off/pick-up etiquette remain areas where we can grow together. We take that feedback seriously and know that improving this experience will require shared awareness and cooperation from all of us.

To ensure smooth traffic flow and safe access for all families, please:

- Keep the parking spots near the PreK wing available for parents/grandparents with very young children
- Always stop at the two-way stop signs  (near Door B)
- Use the crosswalks to help drivers see you crossing
- Please be attentive (off phones), driving slowly through and out of the parking lot using the city's gravel road
- If you need to make phone calls or work in your car for a while, we kindly ask that you move your car further out in the parking lot so that the flow of young families can keep moving

The SFLS K–12 Mentor Program: Your Child Can Have a Mentor!

As iron sharpens iron,

Research consistently shows that children with an abundance of caring adults in their lives thrive. Positive relationships with multiple supportive adults can provide a buffer against mental health challenges, even in the face of adverse childhood experiences. Children with caring adults are more likely to develop resilience, exhibit better social skills, and show increased interest in learning and extracurricular activities. In the same spirit of Jesus laying his hands on the children and blessing them, our Sioux Falls Lutheran mentor program is designed to bless our students through consistent commitment, faithful prayer, caring relationships, and encouragement. (Luke 16:18)

Our Mentor Program is designed to pair one caring adult with a student for a simple weekly lunch-time visit. Students are recommended by parents and/or their classroom teacher after receiving parental permission. From there, our team thoughtfully matches each child with a trained mentor whose gifts and personality fit well. Mentoring isn't about having all the answers—it's about showing up, listening, and helping a child feel valued and seen.

NEEDS-BASED VARIABLE TUITION

K-12 Needs-Based Variable Tuition Applications for 2026-27 school year are now open through TADS. Thanks to our expanding list of generous donors who continue to graciously invest in our mission through donations to our needs-based variable tuition fund, **we are preparing to award up to \$400,000 in needs-based variable tuition to qualifying families** during the 2026-27 school year.

To apply, please log into or create a TADS account for your family at www.mytads.com by clicking on "Financial Aid Assessment." TADS will provide a complete list of required documentation

before you begin your application, but please know that items like your previous year's tax return are required. **Applications for the 2026-27 school year are due by Friday, May 15.**

South Dakota Partners in Education (SDPE) K-12 Scholarship Program

In addition to donor-funded variable tuition through SFLS, qualifying families are also eligible to submit their TADS application to the South Dakota Partners in Education (SDPE) K-12 scholarship program. During the 2025-26 school year alone, SFLS families qualified for over \$206,000 in tuition assistance through SDPE, which allowed us to spread our own variable tuition budget even further. If your family qualifies for SDPE and you plan to apply for variable tuition, please plan to submit your application to both entities.

Earn Tuition Credit through RaiseRight

Finally, please also remember that RaiseRight is available as a source of tuition assistance for all early childhood through 12th grade families. Simply buy gift cards for your favorite brands at face value through RaiseRight and use them, instead of cash or other cards, to make purchases. A percentage of each gift card you buy goes directly into an account for your family and gets applied toward your tuition at designated times throughout the course of the school year.

Common Sense Media recommends that this movie is good for **children ages 6+** due to the flogging and crucifixion of Jesus (not bloody). Here is what they write: Parents need to know that since this animated drama follows animals that encounter Jesus right before the crucifixion, it will primarily appeal to Christian families who are looking to teach their children more about New Testament themes. Since Jesus (who is referred to as "the King" by the animals) is shown being jostled, hit, and eventually flogged and crucified, some very



young children may be disturbed (although most of these scenes are brief and don't show any details). Judah the lamb is also nearly slaughtered (as the sacrificial lamb) but is saved at the last moment.


